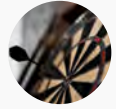

Important Updates from the Manager's Desk

Property Sale: Following the vote by members at our last EGM on 30th March 2026, the club has been listed with Bayleys Real Estate. It is important to note that the property for sale includes only the RSA building and surrounding car parks. The village and the Dee Street Medical Centre are on separate titles and will continue to be owned and managed by the respective trusts.

The Tender deadline is 21st May 2026, and final settlement is likely to be several weeks later.

Opening Hours: The club will be closed on Sundays and Mondays going forward, with normal opening hour Tuesday – Saturday. **Normal operations will cease on Sunday 7th June.** It is likely that the club will still be open one or two days a week after this date; however, this is subject to the sale terms of the site. An update will be provided at the EGM.

From this week, the restaurant will be open Wednesdays through Saturdays. It will close on 21st May when our chef's notice period ends. We are now looking to hire a temporary chef to provide a bar menu to members after this date.

Merger with Club Mount Maunganui: The boards of Club Mount Maunganui and Mount Maunganui RSA met again on Monday 20th April for continued discussions on amalgamation. Negotiations are still in early stages, with firm details yet to be agreed. Once a negotiated proposal is developed, it will be presented to Club Mount Maunganui members to vote on whether to proceed or not.

Management of both clubs currently meet on a weekly basis and report back to their respective executives. We will keep members updated as discussions progress.

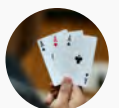

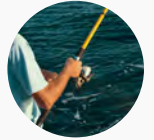


An incredible moment today with the Royal New Zealand Navy Band

Veteran Centre - Now Open

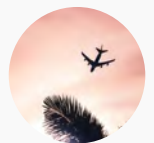
The **Tauranga Western Bay Veteran Centre is now open** and welcomes all currently serving and ex-serving men and women, along with their families, to visit and see the new centre.

President's Report. End of an Era — Beginning of a Future



An extremely busy month has just passed.

At our EGM on Monday 30th March, 85% of members present voted in favour of merging with Club Mount Maunganui. Meetings with Club Mount are ongoing, and things are progressing well with both clubs very much in favour of joining forces.

80% of those present also voted in favour of selling the RSA land and building, and on 31st March we listed the property with Bayleys Real Estate. In the first week of advertising alone, they had 14 requests for information packs, along with some encouraging feedback. Lawyers and valuers are now acting for us through the sale process, alongside our accountants.

Club adjuncts have all been informed and some have already met with Club Mount Manager Fred Ferris and arranged to move over there. Fred has been very accommodating and he, President Dean Wearne and the Club Mount committee are committed to making the whole process as smooth as possible. RSA memberships will transfer in bulk and RSA cards will work at Club Mount once this is complete, probably mid-May.

Once the property sale has taken place our intention is to use some of the proceeds to freehold the land on which Club Mount is located, currently owned by the council, and extend the buildings to best accommodate both clubs going forward. Remaining proceeds will be invested for the long-term betterment of the RSA—to preserve our club for the future. The new joint club will provide an equal (and secure) income for all members to enjoy a place of fellowship for years to come.

ANZAC Day, 25th April dawned chilly but beautifully clear. Leader of Ceremony Mike Savage conducted a moving service, contributed to by guest speaker Lieutenant Colonel Warren Banks, an army veteran of 30+ years. Our national anthem was beautifully performed in both English and Te Reo Māori by Lyla Courtenay from Mount Maunganui College. Head Boy Fletcher Cameron and Head Girl Ara Jurisich also spoke beautifully. A very special thanks to all our cadets, Parade Marshall John Harris; Bugler Peter Cranston; police and ambulance services; and our Support Officer Shelley Kerr.

We are expecting the coming month to be just as busy. Tenders close with Bayleys on 21st May and there is a lot of work to do to bring the two clubs together, and to see in the end of an era at the Mount RSA

Women's Section



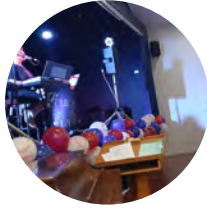

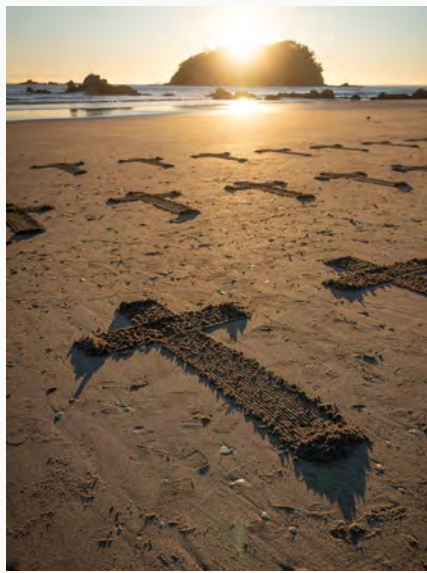
